

Let's give up a few designer coffees (or Coke Zeros) or a lunch out, and use those funds for Care Kits. It will be a most meaningful experience!

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT ONE

- ⇒ light-weight bath-size **towel** (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- ⇒ THREE bath-size bars of **soap** equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ⇒ ONE adult-size **toothbrush** in its original packaging*
- ⇒ ONE **sturdy comb**, remove packaging
- ⇒ ONE metal **nail clipper** (attached file optional), remove packaging

* *Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap*

fold and roll so nothing falls out,
and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
